## GOBA 31: You get to choose!

As the days grow warmer and the scents of spring flowers fill the air, it's almost GOBA time!

Our host towns have been working enthusiastically to get ready to welcome up to 1,500 riders who will "Come Sail Away" on the 31st annual Great Ohio Bicycle Adventure on June 15-22.

This newsletter offers just a sampling of what they have in store for our bicycling voyage to the Lake Erie region. There is truly something for everyone.

GOBA lets you set your own pace on a large loop from Bowling Green to Fremont to Port Clinton to Oregon, then back to Bowling Green.

With two layover days in Port Clinton and one in Oregon, you'll have more opportunities to sightsee along the

Lake Erie shore, visit attractions, do optional rides or just sleep in.

Need guidance? The "GOBA Digest" returns this year with stories about places we'll visit or ride past. Two other GOBA traditions, the bike decorating contest/parade and the song contest, continue.

New for 2019 are more options on how much to ride: as many as seven days and as few as four. And the four "mandatory" days offer routes as short as 35 miles.

If you haven't signed up, register now and save! Adult registration is \$300 through April 30 (and \$325 from May 1-15). Be sure to add GOBA jerseys, T-shirts, raffle tickets and other valuable extras.

Then prepare to set sail on a memorable journey!

## Bowling Green

**Start/finish location: Saturday, June 15, and Saturday, June 22**

Bowling Green, Ohio, loves GOBA and is excited to welcome the Great Ohio Bicycle Adventure for an overnight stay for the fifth time.

This year, the Wood County Fairgrounds and the BG Convention & Visitors Bureau will be your hosts. Convenient, monitored parking for the week will be offered across the street from the fairgrounds, and the Bowling Green High School Athletics program will assist with luggage in exchange for tips. Floor sleeping space will be available at the fairgrounds (details TBA), as will concessions from Bowling Green High School.

Four lodging properties in Bowling Green will offer a group discount rate the night of June 15 to GOBA riders who would like to sleep in a bed and enjoy a free continental breakfast.

The First Christian Church will host a lunch on Saturday, and a Slow Countryside Roll bike ride will be offered in the early afternoon. The BG City Park will offer a group rate for the City Pool and Waterpark, complete with a lazy river great for the whole family.

The Come Sail Away Slow Roll Parade & Kick Off Celebration will start at 4 p.m. as bikes adorned for the GOBA decorating contest roll from the fairgrounds to the celebration site downtown at Wooster Green. Entertainment, food trucks, ice cream and children's activities will be part of the festivities, with

## History and fun for the family!

### RUTHERFORD B. HAYES PRESIDENTIAL LIBRARY AND MUSEUMS

GOBA riders of all ages won't want to miss the Rutherford B. Hayes Presidential Library and Museums at Spiegel Grove, the estate of the 19th president (1877-1881) and his wife, Lucy. The estate includes the beautifully preserved 31-room Hayes Home with original furnishings and artifacts; the renovated museum with two floors of exhibits and original artifacts; the president's tomb; and 25 acres of wooded grounds.

The estate is extending its hours for GOBA and will be open from noon to 6 p.m. Sunday, June 16. Admission will include:

- Tours of the Hayes Home and museum.
- Kids activities throughout the day. Children can make their own campaign ribbon and work on coloring pages, puzzles, etc. Also, adults can make the campaign ribbons, if they would like.
- Photo booth with presidential cutouts.
- Museum scavenger hunt for kids.
- Hands-on artifact activities throughout the day (all ages). Wear the same white preservation gloves our curators wear and hold a piece of history! Our staff will bring out some artifacts from our collections, let guests carefully handle them and share the stories behind them.

### Lakeside Chautauqua

For more than 145 years, Lakeside Chautauqua has welcomed families to the Lake Erie shore to take part in a summer Chautauqua experience dedicated to nurturing mind, body, and spirit. It is an historic community that offers spiritual opportunities, educational lectures, cultural arts performances, and recreational activities during Memorial Day weekend and its 11-week summer programming season. Quaint shopping, unique restaurants, and a variety of accommodations complete the experience.

### Liberty Aviation Museum

Liberty Aviation Museum showcases operational, historical aircraft and vehicles including "Georgie's Gal", a WWII B-25 Mitchell Bomber; a U.S. Navy WWII TBM Avenger; PT-boat; and more. Witness the restoration of a 1929 Ford Tri-Motor and dine in

the 1950s-era themed Tin Goose Diner.

### Marblehead Lighthouse State Park

Marblehead Lighthouse State Park features picnic facilities, fishing, walking trails and the Marblehead Lighthouse, in use since 1822. Climb the 77 steps of the oldest lighthouse in continuous operation on the Great Lakes. Guided tours are available daily 12-4 pm.

### Johnson's Island Confederate Cemetery

This historic cemetery is the final resting place of more than 200 of the 9,000 Confederate soldiers once imprisoned here during the Civil War. The cemetery is in a private residential area on an island accessible by a causeway.

### Put-in-Bay Foodie Trail

Whether your taste buds are craving Mexican, French, Italian, Irish or some truly-American dishes like Texas barbecue or New Orleans French Quarter Jambalaya, there is something for everyone on the Put-in-Bay Foodie Trail.

### Glacial Grooves State Memorial

A National Natural Landmark, the Glacial Grooves on the north side of Kelleys Island are the largest easily accessible such grooves in the world and are accessible daily in season, weather-permitting, via ferry. From a walkway, footbridge, and stairs you can look down on the immense grooves, which are 400 feet long, 35 feet wide, and up to 10 feet deep, suggesting the tremendous power of the ice that formed them. Glacial Grooves Geological Preserve contains marine fossils that are 350 to 400 million years old. They were scoured into solid limestone bedrock about 18,000 years ago by the great

ice sheet which covered part of North America.

## Oregon

### Days 5-6: Thursday, Friday

GOBA riders won't be in a different state during their visit to Oregon, just a different state of mind.

Only 6 miles from downtown Toledo,



the city of Oregon offers both small-town charm and the excitement of being the closest overnight site to a major city in

GOBA's 31-year history.

Oregon has its own identity – a city of around 21,000 people that evolved out of a township and offers an interesting blend of bedroom community, industrial suburb, Lake Erie recreational gateway, and agricultural community with just over a 28 square mile footprint.

This urban-suburban combination means low-traffic cycling roads on the GOBA routes to and from our camp at Clay High School, as well as bike trails that provide access to parks, recreation facilities and the beach at Maumee Bay State Park. Multiple hotels and Toledo attractions – such as the National Museum of the Great Lakes and the Imagination Station hands-on science museum – are a short bus ride from camp.

The town coordinators in Oregon have put together a long "to-do" list of activities sure to delight GOBA riders. Among the highlights:

### ELECTRICAL DEVICES

The information is kept confidential and used only in the event of a medical emergency to offer appropriate aid. The CycleWerks Bicycle & Fitness shop at 248 S. Main St. in downtown Bowling Green can assemble bikes sent to the store and pack them to be sent home. Please check with the shop at 419-352-9375 on the availability of this service and deadlines. Customers will need to arrange with a third party for shipping to and from the store. Safety is important on GOBA. Please review the Safety Pledge that will be sent to you via email. All riders will be asked to sign the pledge at check-in in order to receive their rider packets.

In addition, everyone, especially new riders and parents with kids under 14, is invited to the Safety Show (20 minutes), running continuously Saturday afternoon, June 15, starting at 2 p.m.

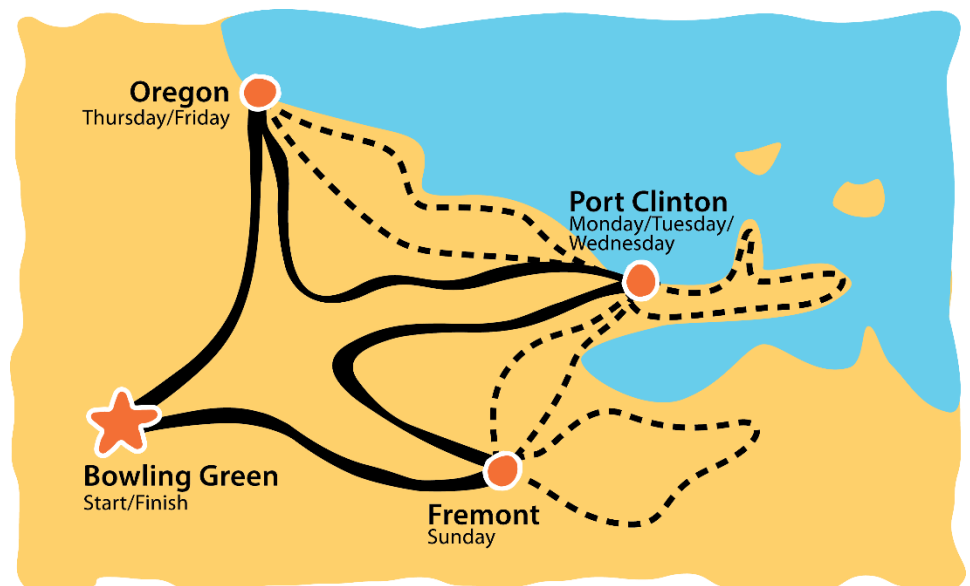

## ALTERNATIVE LODGING OPTIONS

GOBA is first and foremost a camping tour. However, if you want to stay in a hotel or B&B, check directly with the property or the local visitors bureau – see the Alternative Lodging page on the GOBA website for links. Make your own arrangements, including transport at your own expense. Hotels may or may not be on the free bus shuttle route in each overnight community; however we hope to announce plans by May for a low-cost service that will shuttle you and your bike to and from off-site lodging.

### INDOOR FLOOR SPACE

Floor sleeping may be very limited, since stringent fire regulations limit the facilities that can offer this. All space is first-come, first-served. Local nonprofit groups secure the facilities and the fee you pay goes entirely to them. Some may take reservations and payment through the GOBA website, and others may not. Here is the status for each overnight town:

**BOWLING GREEN** – The local committee is seeking a group to offer floor space in a building at the fairgrounds.

**FREMONT** – Air-conditioned sleeping will be offered for \$20 on Sunday night in the Neeley Conference Center at Terra State. Register at <https://app.donorview.com/qqRZ>

**PORT CLINTON** – The local committee is seeking a group to offer floor space in a gym at the high school or adjacent middle school.

**OREGON** – Floor sleeping will be available for \$20 for two nights (\$10 per night) in the gym at Clay High School. Register at <https://app.donorview.com/qqRZ>
